- The following members were appointed to standing and ad-hoc committees: Bel O'Neill to Communications, Britney Casey and Lauren Bardol to Community Events, Rozlyn Giddens to Signage Ad-hoc and Landscape & Facilities Maintenance (LFMC), Valerie Huelsman to LFMC, Teresa Padilla and Bill Manning to Signage ad-hoc, and Terry Basham to Triathlon
- Approved the use of the annual Brightview contract credit of \$5,000.00 to mulch the tree rings on the Waterway Drive medians and eyebrows.

# The following Community Guidelines were amended at the May 10, 2023 Board of Directors Meeting and will go into effect June 9, 2023

\* Items in RED font denotes added text, <del>strikethrough</del> denotes deleted text, and highlighted denotes text added by the IHA Board of Directors to their documents, but not included in MPOA's Article 5 amendments.

#### **Article 3 Amendments:**

**3.3.1 Standing Committees, Section d. Communications Committee -** To provide ideas to enhance all avenues of communications within the community, as well as between the BOD and members of the association. These avenues of communication include, but are not limited to; the MPOA website, MPOA social media, The Montclairion, Records information System, and Communication within the communications Committee provides creative and technical methods to enhance all avenues of communication within the community as well as between the BOD and members of the association. The committee also suggests methods of facilitating information flow from sources outside of the Montclair community. These avenues of communication include but are not limited to the MPOA web site, the MPOA Facebook page, the Montclairion, FRSConnect, mailings, and community bulletin boards.

#### **Enclosure 1c – Communications Committee Charter:**

#### 2. Objectives.

a. To provide creative and technical methods ideas to enhance all avenues of communications within the community, as well as between the BOD and members of the association. The committee also suggests methods of facilitating information flow from sources outside of the Montelair community. These avenues of communication include but are not limited to; the MPOA website, the MPOA Facebook page Social Media, The Montelairion, FSR-Connect Records information System, mailings, and community bulletin boards. Community E-newsletter.

#### 4. Requirements.

- a. The committee shall develop both a near term and long term "Montelair Communications Plan-an MPOA Style Guide" to be reviewed and updated no less frequently than annually.
- b. The Committee will coordinate and work with other Montclair groups or outside organizations as appropriate.
- c. The committee shall <del>coordinate</del> assist with <del>plans</del> and communications activities</del> for other MPOA standing committees, as appropriate.

#### 5. Administration.

- a. Article 3 of the Community Guidelines of Montclair (Committees) will be used as the basic document for administration of the committee's activities.
- b. The Committee shall consist of a Chairperson and interested residents of Montclair. Meetings shall be conducted monthly. Committee members are expected to work both as a group and independently on special projects as appropriate. In addition, the BOD will assign a Board member as a liaison; this Board member may or may not be a member of the MPAC.

#### Enclosure 2b. - Business Review Board (BRB) Charter, Section 5c - Administration:

C. The President shall establish a schedule of appointments of directors to the BRB to run from April 1 of one calendar year to March 30 of the next calendar year. The term of each member of the BRB shall be nine months, staggered by intervals of three months. The President shall designate a chair of the BRB for each calendar quarter. The BRB will consist of three (3) members of the BOD appointed by the President. The initial terms will be, one member one calendar quarter, one member two calendar quarters, one member three calendar quarters. Thereafter, the term of each member shall be three calendar quarters. The Chairperson will be appointed by the President of the BOD.

4.2.6 Other Activities-Dolphin Beach Restroom Opening Schedule.

**4.2.7** Other Activities. The MPOA beaches and other common areas are for recreational use. Reservations or use of the picnic areas on behalf of outside groups or organizations is not allowed without prior approval of the Board.

#### **Article 5 Amendments**

#### 5.4.6 Decks

<u>Pre-Approved:</u> Repair / Replace deck board, rail, and benches in the existing size, style, and color. Lattice and screening are permitted when placed on a previously approved deck.

- A. Repair/replace deck boards, rails and benches in the existing size, style, and color.
- B. Replacement of lattice/screening in existing style color and location.
- C. Changes to color and/or materials of deck boards and benches in neutral wood tones. Changes to color and /or materials of deck rails in black, brown, gray, or white. Changes to color and/or materials of deck rails, lattice/screening in neutral wood tones, black, brown, gray, or white.
- D. Any changes to size, shape or structural members require a PIR.

**Island Homes:** Fairfield 911 Stain (same as siding) or Natural Brown Wood. Wood deck replacements with prefinished composite materials and aluminum rail systems from Treks, Azek, TimberTech, or other similar companies are acceptable. Finish colors shall be in the manufacturer's gray or brown family, handrails can be black, brown, or white aluminum in color. Lighting is optional. Wood decks and handrails shall be stained or painted using McCormick Fairfiled 911 color (same as siding).

#### 5.4.8 Docks, Piers, Wharves, and Shoreline Improvements

#### **Pre-Approved:**

- A. Repair / Replace deck boards, rails, and benches in the existing size, style, and color.
- B. Changes to color and/or materials of deck boards, rails, and benches in neutral wood tones. If updating to modern materials it must appear consistent with wood.
- C. Any changes to size, shape or structural members require a PIR.

#### 5.4.10 Doors, Entry/Storm, and Garage

#### **Pre-Approved:**

- A. Full or split view, clear glass storm doors that are white or match the front door color or trim color of the house and doors.
- B. Replacement of entry/storm and garage doors which are like for like, except for modern materials.

**Island Homes:** Only full view glass storm doors in white are permitted on cluster homes. All front doors on the island must have an approved PIR and should attempt alignment with the original builder installed door and be in harmony with the architectural design of the community. Side-facing cluster home doors are traditionally glass and the front facing doors are traditionally full-paneled. Garage doors for cluster homes may be of wood construction or aluminum and in a color as close to the trim color of McCormick Exterior Luster Latex, Amber White paint as possible. Only full view glass storm doors in white are permitted on cluster homes. All front doors on the island must have an approved PIR and should attempt alignment with the original builder installed door and be in harmony with the architectural design of the community. Side facing cluster home doors are traditionally glass and the front facing doors are traditional full-paneled.

#### 5.4.35 Roofing

Island Cluster Homes: Only cedar shake roofs or Enviroshake synthetic shakes (MT100) to be installed at staggered widths on Island Cluster Homes are acceptable. The Island Board of Directors can provide names of installers. Only cedar shake roofs or Enviroshake synthetic shakes are permitted on Island Cluster homes. Enviroshake synthetic shakes installed are the color Aged Cedar. Point of contact for Installers can be obtained from the Island BOD.

#### 5.4.39 Sheds

#### **Requirements and Restrictions:**

A. A shed is defined as a free-standing framed structure (using wood, metal, or aluminum studs.), with a continuous solid or fully grouted masonry or concrete foundation. Plastic, metal, and composite sheds will be considered on a case-by-case basis and must meet the foundation requirements as noted above. All other

structures will be considered outdoor storage containers. (See Community Guideline 5.4.28 – Outdoor Storage Containers)

#### 5.4.41 Siding

#### **Pre-Approved:**

A. A PIR is not required for modern material replacement to replace the siding in the existing style, and similar color.

#### 5.4.49 Windows & Window Coverings

#### Pre-Approved:

A. Modern material replacement windows in the existing style, similar color, grid pattern and location. Replacement windows in the existing style, color, grid pattern and location.

## Swimmer Safety: Swimming near boat docks can be deadly; tips for avoiding electrocution

Information from BoatUS Foundation:

Recent fatalities by electrocution are bringing scrutiny to an age-old summer ritual that's common on waterfronts across America: swimming near boat docks.

Electrocution can happen when swimmers make contact with energized metal dock fittings, boats or other structures due to faulty alternating current (AC) wiring.

Electric shock drowning (ESD) occurs when AC gets into freshwater from faulty wiring and passes through a swimmer, causing paralysis or even sudden death. Unlike electrocution, with ESD a swimmer does not need to be touching a boat or dock structure, and even tiny amounts of electricity can be incapacitating and lead to drowning.

The risk of ESD is greatest in fresh- or brackish water, so some areas such as estuaries or rivers may only be in the danger zone after heavy rains. Tingling in the swimmer's body is one of the early warning signs of ESD.

The BoatUS Foundation, the boating-safety arm of the nations' largest recreational boat owners group, has some tips to prevent an electrocution tragedy:

- Never swim around boat docks that use electricity.
- Post "no swimming" signs.
- Have a qualified electrician with experience in dock electrical service inspect your private dock annually.
- Install ground-fault protection on your boat and private dock.

• Ask your marina if they have installed ground-fault protectio and if the electrical system is inspected and tested annually, just in case, someone falls overboard. No one should ever swim in a marina.

• Periodically test your boat for electrical leakage into the water.

• If you see a distressed person in the water near a boat dock, first shut off power to the dock at the breaker panel, and if equipped, disconnect any power cable to the vessel. If power cannot be shut down, follow the "reach, throw, row, but don't go" mantra by using an oar, boat hook or throw a flotation device to reach the stricken person.

## Boat and Dock Safety: Prevent Deadly Shocks - Check Your Boats and Docks

If you own a boat and/or a dock, Safe Electricity reminds you to take steps to prevent deadly shocks, also known as Electric Shock Drowning (ESD).

An important step in helping prevent any tragedies is to ensure proper installation and maintenance of electrical equipment on docks and on boats. Take the time to inspect all electrical systems on or near the water.

Safe Electricity, with the American Boat and Yacht Council and International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers/National Electrical Contractors Association, recommends adhering to these steps to improve water recreation safety and accident prevention:

- All electrical installations should be performed by a professional electrical contractor familiar with marine codes and standards and inspected at least once a year.
- Docks should have ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) breakers on the circuits feeding electricity to the dock.
- The metal frame of docks should be bonded to connect all metal parts to the alternating current (AC) safety ground at the power source. That will ensure any part of the metal dock that becomes energized because of electrical malfunction will trip the circuit breaker.
- Neighboring docks can also present a shock hazard. Make your neighbors aware of the need for safety inspections and maintenance. Marinas should comply with National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and National Electric Code (NEC) codes.

Here are a few additional tips to remember for your boat's electrical system, particularly those with AC systems:

- Regardless of the size of boat, maintenance of the electrical system should be done by a professional familiar with marine electrical codes.
- Have your boat's electrical system checked at least once a year. Boats should also be checked when something is added to or removed from their systems.

Boats with AC systems should have isolation transformers or equipment leakage circuit interrupter (ELCI) protection, comply with ABYC standards, and be serviced by an ABYC Certified® Technician.

#### If you are in the water and feel electric current:

- Shout to let others know.
- Tuck your legs up to make yourself smaller.
- Try to go away from anything that could be energized.
- Do not head to boat or clock ladders to get out.

#### If you are on the dock or shore when a swimmer feels electrical current:

- Do not jump in.
- Throw them a flotation device.
- Unplug or turn off the source of electricity as quickly as possible.
- Then call for help.

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

#### COUNTY CAUSED DELAY IN DREDGING LAKE MONTCLAIR By: Larry Lehowicz

About every seven years or so Lake Montclair needs to be dredged. Otherwise, it could silt over and our lake would become a soggy wetland. One year ago, MPOA contracted with a company to do the dredging and per previous contracts to dispose of the dredging's (spoil) in the county landfill.

PWC then announced the landfill was filling and prohibited the deposition of our spoil there. MPOA has contacted PWC staff, elected supervisors and others to try to find a solution. After one year we seem no closer to a solution.

As a cautionary tale, there was an article in the Washington Post\* about the silting over of the Fairfax County owned Lake Accotink. Several years ago, due to cost considerations, Lake Accotink was not dredged on schedule. Over four years silting continued and cost for dredging increased by a factor of three which Fairfax says is unaffordable. Although it is controversial with Lake Accotink homeowners, Fairfax County has proposed letting the Lake just simply go away and become a large wetland.

Clearly, Lake Montclair and our property values may be placed in duress similar to Lake Accotink if we do not carry out the needed dredging of our lake.

At the recent MPOA Annual Meeting, I discussed this problem with several attendees who similar to me are concerned about the long-term viability of our lake. A comment was made that Montclair residents (VOTERS!) should consider contacting Andrea Bailey, our PWC Potomac District Supervisor, and ask for an expedited solution.

A possible message from you to her might be:

Supervisor Bailey, my name and address are \_\_\_\_\_\_. As a Montclair homeowner in your Potomac district, I am very concerned about PWC precluding Montclair from disposing of our lake's dredging's in the county landfill which has been done for years. Please expedite a solution. Without a quick fix, dredging costs will rise significantly and the future viability of the lake and my home value will be at high risk. Thank you for your leadership on this important matter.

Silt disposal is a regional problem without a clear solution from the county in sight. Montclairions are also encouraged to attend meetings of the PWC Board of County Supervisors (BCS) where you can address Supervisor Bailey and her colleagues directly on this issue. Any PWC resident can address the BCS on any topic during Public Comment Time at the meeting.
